Walk/Run Field Trips

The classroom curriculum is significantly enriched and expanded when students visit and observe for themselves certain aspects of community life and the natural environment. A typical school neighbourhood field trip might include activities such as science walks to study local vegetation, a visit to a local library or a cross-country run. School field trips provide valuable educational experiences and are planned as an enriched part of the total school program.

Guidelines are in place governing the number of supervisors who will accompany students on each school field trip and these guidelines also apply to walk/run field trips. Walk/run field trips are no further than approximately 4km away from the school. Every reasonable precaution will be taken to ensure the safety of students. No regular walk/run field trip will exceed one day.

By signing this annual permission form, you understand that the principal will have approved all walk/run field trips and that you will be given advanced notice of any additional dates and the option to have your child not go on the field trip. ***Please inform your child's teacher if you do not want them to participate in a specific walk/run field trip.***

I understand that I will receive prior notice (ex. planner, email, newsletter) for each walk/run field trip my child will be participating in.

School Communication
