CURRICULUM / CLASSES

Students are enrolled in 4 courses during the term of their stay. Non-credit students do not have priority for specific course enrolments. They are placed in courses where space is available.

If the student has any specific course requests, CISS MLI can request, without guarantee. Students should not arrive with the expectation of being in specific classes. This programme should be viewed as an academic, linguistic and cultural experience only in Canada

Students will be placed in 4 courses from the following general areas:

- English (language arts)
- Maths
- Sciences
- Social Studies History, Geography, Law, Economics, Family studies and more
- Arts music, visual art, drama, dance
- Business Studies
- Computer/IT Studies
- Culinary
- Hospitality
- 3rd languages
- Physical Education
- Robotics
- Technical Studies Communication, Drafting, Design, Automotive, Mechanical, Woodworking and more

ENGLISH PROFICIENCY

Most schools will accept all levels of proficiency with the notation that should they deem the student to need ESL support, the classes will be adjusted to maximize English proficiency learning. This may include an ESL class and/ or selection of other classes that will be of an appropriate language level for the student which may also include classes that are in a lower grade level that the enrolment level

BEHAVIOURAL EXPECTATIONS

This is a Short-Term Experience programme intended to allow students to gain an experience of life in a Canadian high school; Students must

- Respect their teachers, peer and school staff
- Speak English
- Follow daily Monday Friday classes in up to 4 subjects during their term of stay
- School attendance is mandatory on each day that the school in open. Students are also expected to arrive on-time for each class as truancy and tardiness will lead to student discipline.
- Obey all programme rules

COVALIDATION

- Student will not receive credit for their courses so covalidation is not possible
- Official transcripts will not be provided nor can the school provide a report with teacher comments. A general student report from CISS MLI is possible which will outline the classes taken by the student
- If the student is in attendance over the mid-term period, he/she may receive a mid-term report.

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EXTRA-CURRICULAR

SPORTS

Short-Term students interested in joining a competitive sports team may be restricted by their dates. Team members must be enrolled for the duration of the sport season to be considered. Coaches may be open to allowing students to train with a team, but any such decision is solely at the discretion of the sport coach.
