PROGRAMME INFO

IB CURRICULUM

The **Diploma Programme** prepares students for university and encourages them to:

- utilize Grades 11 and 12 for intensive university preparation
- ask challenging questions
- learn how to learn
- develop a strong sense of their own identity and culture
- develop the ability to communicate with and understand people from other countries and cultures
- receive up to a year's worth of academic credit upon entry to the University
- promote international understanding through shared academic experience

Students can opt for:

- IB Diploma, which requires that students complete courses from six specific subject areas and complete three additional requirements (Extended Essay, Theory of Knowledge and Creativity/Action/Service) OR
- IB Certificate, for those students who do not wish to enrol in the full Diploma programme, but take only a few IB courses as part of their course load

At the end of the two-year programme, students are assessed both internally and externally in ways that measure individual performance against stated objectives for each subject.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

AP is a focus on a broad, in-depth study of one or more subjects (English, math, sciences, social studies, fine and performing arts, languages, and/or computer science). AP courses are selected as part of the student's course load; not every course needs to be selected as AP. School offerings of AP courses vary, and individual schools may not offer all subject areas with AP options.

Advanced Placement:

- enables students to pursue college level studies while in a supportive high school environment
- offers flexibility to enter AP at any level, depending on previous learning because AP recognition occurs when the student successfully complete a College Board AP Examination in a subject
- develop the knowledge, skills, and strategies to successfully write the Advanced Placement Examination(s) in early May of the Grade 11 and/or 12 year
- AP exams do NOT replace diploma exams in any province.
- AP exams are based on Grade 12 level courses. Pre-AP classes may be possible in the lower grade levels

NOTE:

Every college has its own credit policies concerning AP and IB test scores, and students should research individual college policies.

No high school can promise college credit based on these test scores.
